

Application Questions

These questions are provided for your further study and application of today's message. Thoughtfully writing out the answers to these questions and praying through the issues will help you further meditate upon God's Word in order to see the areas of your life that need change.

1. Read Psalm 9:1—10. In verse 1, David says that he will "tell of all Your wonders." If someone asked you to name some wonders that your God has performed, what would you say? What would be on your list?

2. If you came across someone struggling because of a particularly difficult trial that has been caused by an unjust action against him or her, what would you say? How would you counsel them? What are some practical things that you could do with them so that they would have the response of verses 1 and 2?

3. Is it wrong to pray for the destruction of your enemies? Didn't Jesus teach us to love our enemies? Did King David not get the memo? Why is it right for David to pray for the Lord to act and destroy his enemies?

4. When you read of God's judgment of the wicked and the nations what do you think of? Does it seem 'unfair'? Does it seem too harsh? What would you say to someone who was struggling with this notion of God's judgment of the wicked people of this world?

5. What are some additional thoughts and/or application from this morning's lesson? What does this passage teach you about the nature of man and about the nature of God?
